15 years ago, Volume 3 Issue 2 Fall 2002 This issue of the ELDA newsletter highlights the recent biennial retreat held in Ashland, Nebraska. "Experience the Good Life in Jesus" was the conference theme. Workshops, business meetings, social times, local tours and worship services were all part of the conference. Dorothy Sparks gave a workshop on "Deaf Worship" and "Stress Managment" was led by Pratt Counselors. New Board members were elected; Linda Wasilowski (Fairbanks), MN as Secretary, Luanne Duennerman, NE as Treasurer and Pr. Gisele Berninghaus, WI as Pastoral Advisor. Pr Russ Rockwell was the newsletter Editor.

10 years ago, Volume 5 Issue 1 February 2007 Leslie Riggs, WI was the newsletter Editor. At every ELDA Conference, something different and unusal happens. In 2004, Pastor Rockwell's name tag mysteriously became Oly's mustache. In 2006, during a Deaf worship led by Dorothy Sparks, her sermon was briefly interprupted by a bat that swooped into the chapel. Pr. Joe Varsanyi stepped down as pastor at St Phillip's Lutheran Church and received a call to be Director of Pastoral Care for a hospital in Philadelphia. Christ the King Deaf Church celebrated its 15th anniversary and Bread of Life Deaf Church celebrated 50 years. Dorothy Sparks, MN recieved a Certificate of Completion in Deaf Ministry from St Thomas University in Miami, FL on Januarry 3, 2007. Don Rosenkjar sent a nice article and pictures for the newsletter, from their global mission trip to Vietnam and Cambodia.

**5 years ago,** Volume 9 Issue 29 October 2012 President Mark Koterwski reminds us

in his President report to remember what we have learned at the conference. The conference was held in Sioux Falls. SD and the conference theme was "Love in Action". The group at the conference was involved in the "Feed the Hungry Children" project. It was agreed by the conference assembly that ELDA will join with ECD for the 2014 conference. Four ELDA members joined a group of 16 hearing and deaf members (ages from 13 to 70) for a ten day mission trip to Montego Bay, Jamaica. Their mission was to work with the students and staff at the Jamaica School for the Deaf which is located in the mountains above the coastal city. The group was also able to visit the CSSD Deaf Village and to observe the training programs. The mission trip was led by Carol Stevens from the United Methodist Deaf Ministries.



# WHAT WE BELIEVE Pastor russ rockwell



#### "What We Believe"

Twenty years ago, when I first started working in a Deaf church, there weren't a lot of resources I could use in my teaching ministry. When I was in my Hearing church, I could order a variety of different of resources; but, sadly, teaching resources for Deaf ministry were "few and far between."

I noticed how many of us who worked in Deaf ministry had to make our own resources, or adapt Hearing church resources to accommodate ASL. Little from church publishers could be used "off the shelf" in Deaf ministry.

Today, after 20+ years Deaf ministry, I can say that little has changed. There are still not enough teaching resources to use in Deaf ministry.

This ongoing need for Deaf teaching materials led me to create a first-of-its-kind resource -- a digital book called "What We Believe."

"What We Believe" was created especially for Deaf people who want to learn more about God, faith, and the Bible. "What We Believe" is made for iPads, iPhones, & Macs. It has 74 videos of ASL explanations of onscreen text. In total, "What We Believe" has 100 minutes of signed ASL video. After watching the video, the text on the page is easier to understand.

"What We Believe" has five chapters covering the basic beliefs of the Christian faith. Deaf members of WOLD who previewed the book liked what they saw. We remember our coming Easter celebration, all in arrears. In our avowed commitment to reach deaf people for Christ, and thus ensure that they realize all of their potentials in Christ, I went to Ibadan in November to participate in a program and a meeting for the upcoming Easter camp 2018. I am sorry for the lack in sharing with our progress reports from time to time. I am aware of this mistake often and I will find a way of correcting it. #### The Hendersons at the Haiti Deaf Academy

The Haiti Deaf Academy was established in 2013 to serve Deaf children in Haiti. Many older Deaf people in Haiti had no opportunity to attend school. So, when Kathryn Montoya and Margaret Spratlin asked a group of Deaf people in the community of Leveque how they could help them, the Deaf replied, please start a school for Deaf children.

Children come from all different areas and live at the HDA home in Cabaret while they go to school in Leveque 15 minutes away. Meredith first visited HDA while she was on a mission trip with a Deaf team in July 2015. Since Meredith had worked as a Dorm counselor at Tennessee School for the Deaf in college, seeing these Haitian children reminded her of how much she loved Deaf children. She returned to Minnesota and told her husband, Keith, that she derson at the Haiti Deaf wanted to go back to Haiti Deaf Academy. Keith was surprised when she said **Academy** she wanted to go and serve for 2 or 3 months at a time, instead of going for only a 1 week mission trip.

Over the next two years, Keith went to Haiti three times with Meredith, and she went another 3 times with Deaf mission teams. The Haiti Deaf Academy Board of Directors saw their love for the students and asked if they would please read the job description for a newly created position and pray about accepting it. The position was for a couple who would be the In-country Director of Operations for HDA.

Keith and Meredith took the position and moved to Haiti before summer school in 2017. And as a special God wink, they flew in on the same date that Meredith had arrived in Haiti for her first trip two years earlier.

HDA is home to 45 students, from 5 to 18 years old. They have 16 staff members and 11 of them are Deaf. HDA and Keith and Meredith have two main goals. First, they all want the students to understand who God is and His love for them, so they can come to a saving faith in Jesus Christ. The second goal is for them to have educational or vocational training so they can provide for themselves and help their families, if needed, once they are 18 and leave HDA.

One of the students has been taking sewing lessons. Since every child who attends school in Haiti wears a uniform, they hope Dacheca will be able to develop her skills so she can work as a tailor. Then HDA can hire her to sew their uniforms, but she can also get work sewing for other schools.

Keith and Meredith made a 2-year commitment to serve at HDA, but they expect they will work as Directors for about 4 or 5 more years. As they serve, they are asking the Lord to bring along a Haitian couple to train and mentor. Then, in time, the Haitian couple can take their place.



HDA students return home for Christmas break, Easter break, for two weeks in June, and then for the month of August. Those who live nearby are encouraged to go home on the weekends.

This fall HDA is helping the students learn to teach Haitian Sign Language to their own families and friends. And they are encouraging each family to come and take weekly HSL classes if they live nearby. HDA is also working on developing HSL materials.

This new year we have an opportunity for a small ELDA group to visit our friend, Pastor Ruth Ulea, in Nigeria. Many of you met her at the ELDA Conference in St. Paul, MN in the summer of 2016. Maybe she visited your church. Pr. Ruth is Deaf, pastors the Lutheran Church of Christ, Nigeria (LCCN), and teaches at a small deaf school next to the church. Look for pictures of LCCN in this newsletter.

Pr. Ruth wants us to come at Easter time so we can see her Easter Camp. Jay Johnson, a Lutheran engineer who helps set up clean water wells in the area, will lead this trip. Dorothy Sparks and I are committed to going and we invite you to join us. The cost of this two-week trip will be about \$3,250 which includes a round trip air fare to Nigeria plus several smaller airplane trips in the country. The dates of this trip are tentatively March 27--April 8/9.

You will need a visa and a current passport that does not expire until September 2018. You must be able to accept hot dry weather (80--110 degrees), new foods, and new experiences. We will NOT be in fancy hotels. We will be visiting Deaf schools, churches, and people.

Pr. Ruth was a secretary to Pr. Andrew Foster when she was young. Foster was the first African American Deaf man to graduate from Gallaudet in 1954. He went to Africa and taught the Deaf people ASL and many skills. He set up 32 deaf schools in central Africa before he died in a small plane crash in Rwanda in 1987. Gallaudet has named an auditorium after him and has an exhibit in their museum about his work.


Reformation 500 year celebration
